About the programme

This workshop aims to assist participants as assessors to improve their understanding of assessment practices, to explore some of the challenges and to be able to answer questions such as:

- What is 'good practice' in assessment?
- How do they know when they are gathering quality evidence?
- How much evidence is enough?
- What are some contemporary approaches to quality assessment and evidence gathering that are time and cost effective?
- How can they ensure their skills support the gathering of quality evidence?
- What are some of the challenges and issues they may encounter as assessors?
- How can they gain further confidence in their professional judgment?
- How can they ensure their knowledge and skills are current as an assessor?

This practical one day workshop will examine assessment concepts as well as develop innovative approaches to the assessment process within a quality framework.

Intended for

Trainers and assessors working to enhance their assessment skills and develop confidence in professional judgment, consider innovative approaches in their assessment practice.

This includes:

- assessors who are new to assessment and looking for an introduction
- assessors seeking professional development to maintain currency
- assessors with experience of carrying out assessment but no formal qualifications in assessment.

Contents

- Understanding assessment concepts such as competency, evidence, validity
- Describe what is quality assessment practice
- Determine what is quality evidence and make professional judgments
- Identify the best methods for gathering evidence in a range of assessment contents
- Identify key knowledge and skills needed by assessors and ways to ensure your currency as an assessor
- Propose solutions to common assessment challenges and issues

 Undertake assessment roles such as developing assessment tools or setting up assessment or recognition of prior learning processes.

Training methodology

Teaching by targeted activities, group discussions and participation, probably describes the training methodology most accurately. Participants will be actively involved in the learning and be assessed on practical techniques during the programme.

Workshop outcome

On completion of the programme, participants should be able to apply the practical skills to plan and implement workplace assessment practice and learning in their workplace environment.
